Meet surf lifesavers Louise & Peter!

Hi, we are **Peter** and **Louise** Lambeth from Ocean Beach on the NSW Central Coast. Peter was one of our clubs first nippers and has been a lifesaver for an amazing 53 years. Louise decided to join Peter on the beach and has been a lifesaver for 14 years.

Being lifesavers means we are part of a wonderful team who are dedicated to keeping people safe at the beach. We have participated in five SLSNSW <u>Beach to Bush</u> tours which are a lot of fun. Some schools we visited were big and some were very small. We love meeting the students and teachers and sharing our surf safety knowledge!

Our surf safety tip is to remember that the ocean is changeable: it can be calm and then bigger waves could roll in. It's important to stop and watch the ocean to see what kind of waves there are. Ask a surf lifesaver to help identify the best waves to swim in and always stay between the red and yellow flags so they can see you.



Have a question for our lifesavers?

Do your students need a fact for a project they are trying to finish, or just out of curiosity would like a question answered by our lifesavers who are passionate about beach and ocean safety? Our lifesavers love sharing their extensive knowledge: from where is the safest place to swim at the beach? to what is a Portuguese man o' war? <u>Ask an Expert</u>!

Water Safety Books for students

Louise (our featured lifesaver) has written two water safety children's books which she would love to share with teachers and parents:

Annie and the Waves:

Annie lives in the country. She meets two surf lifesavers at her school who advise her how to stay safe at the beach. When Annie and her family go on a holiday to the beach, she discovers the ocean is changeable. With the help of her family and the lifesavers Annie learns to love swimming in the ocean. On the last day of her holiday Annie experiences a surging wave that drags her into the deeper water. Will she remember how to tell the surf lifesavers she needs help? 
28th November to 2nd December: BIG BEACH WEEK 2022
