7. If you are at the beach and you see a sign that says "beach closed" do you think you should still swim? Why or why not?

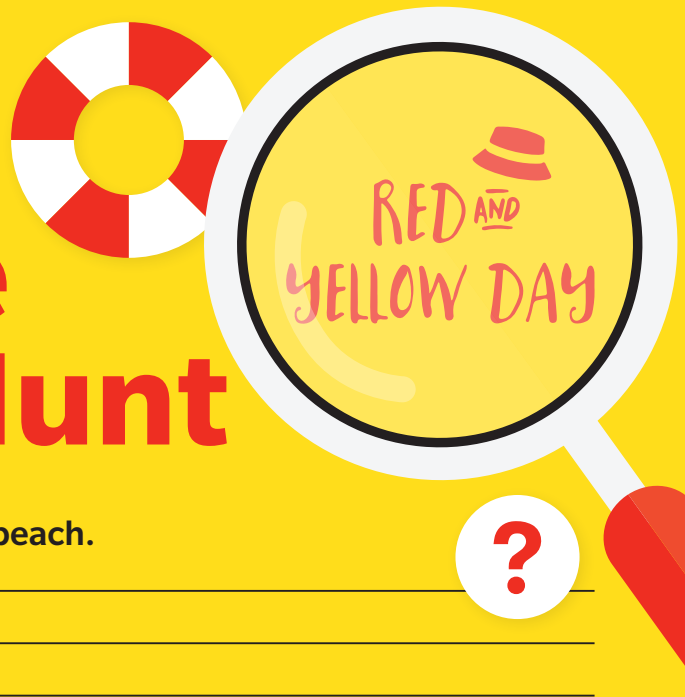
